Tip of the Week

Before applying for positions, here are a few things to think about:

- Have a think about how your skills and experience might translate to the position you are interested in. For instance, do you have organisational skills, customer service experience or a driving background for example. Don't forget any volunteer work and life experience that you may have.
- If an employer is asking for certain qualifications, make sure you have them before applying for the position. Do you need a ticket/licence etc?
- Are you prepared to meet any time commitments that the employer is specifically requesting? Some may be able to change their requirements to suit you, but others may not.
- Be honest the employer is wanting to know if you are suitable for them, just as much as you want to enjoy your time working for them. If you are not sure if your skills or experience are suitable for the position, contact the employer to discuss it with them.
- Above all enjoy yourself. If you don't happen to get the position you were interested in, don't be
 discouraged. Asking for feedback from the employer on what you could improve for next time can help with
 applying for the next position.
